It's That Time of Year! Nevada Traction Device Requirements

Nevada chain requirements vary from chain requirements in other states.

CONDITIONS /TRACTION DEVICES	NEVADA REQUIREMENTS	CALIFORNIA REQUIREMENTS
Chains or Snow Tires Required	Vehicles < 10,000 GVW are required to use snow tires or approved traction devices. Vehicles > 10,000 GVW must use chains on driving wheels and braking wheels of trailer. Four-wheel-drive OK with four mud-snow (M-S) tires. NAC 484.240 (1)	Cars and light trucks < 6,000 GVW must have mud-snow (M-S) tires on driving wheels. Motorists are advised to carry chains. Vehicles > 6,000 GVW must use chains on drive wheels. (R-1)
Chains Required, Except For	Chains required on all vehicles, except four- wheel-drive with four mud-snow (M-S) tires. NAC 484.240 (2)	Chains required on all vehicles, except four-wheel-drives or all-wheel-drives with snow tread tires on all four wheels. All-wheel-drive and four-wheel-drive vehicles must carry chains. (R-2)
Chains Mandatory	Nevada does not use this condition.	Chains required on ALL VEHICLES without exception. (R- 3)

Nevada Snapshot

Here is some interesting data that you can find while searching through the FMCSA website:

State of Nevada:

- : 9,776 unique DOT numbers
- : 8,225 DOT numbers with recent inspection activity
- : 34,079 power units within those DOT numbers
- : 18,875 straight trucks within those DOT numbers
- : 402 motor carriers have at least one Alert in the SMS system
- : 77 motor carriers have an Alert in Unsafe Driving

Nevada Advances Heat Illness Regulations

On October 22, 2024, the NV Department of Business & Industry, Division of Industrial Relations held an adoption hearing on the proposed heat illness regulations. This regulation now moves to the Legislature for a final vote.

To summarize, Nevada's regulation does NOT stipulate a specific temperature under which the rules come into play. Rather, the regulation requires a one-time job hazard analysis that will focus on factors exacerbating heat illness such as temperature, humidity and required personal protective equipment. It also sets a standard to mitigate heat illness symptoms with water, rest and shade (where applicable).

Did You Know?

DataQs is an FMCSA system that allows you to request a review of inspection & crash data you believe to be incomplete or inaccurate.

The system enables you to improve the accuracy of your Safety Measurement System safety profile. And remember, much of that information is open to the public!

Did a driver get an inspection that had errors?

Do you have a "not at fault" crash on your record in the last 24 months?

Nevada Responds to Industry Concerns Survey

In August, NTA circulated a request for our members to respond to a survey distributed by the American Transportation Research Institute (ATRI) to identify the top issues in trucking. Below are the results of that survey. The first column is made up of responses from Nevada companies, while the other columns are the priorities identified by all respondents (divided by motor carrier and driver-specific responses).

As you can see, NTA members have identified priorities around some of the most concerning issues in the industry – battery electric vehicle mandates, the economy and fuel prices.

 NEW! Pre-Employment Screening Program (PSP) Monitoring program for Drivers. PSP Monitoring is an optional new service that automatically informs drivers when their PSP data changes. Drivers who subscribe for the free monitoring service will receive an email each time their PSP record changes. This PSP monitoring service is offered free of charge and is for use by drivers only.
