Update on SB260 – Outdoor Air Quality Regulation

Nevada Senate Bill 260 (2025) establishes protections for outdoor workers exposed to wildfire smoke by requiring employers to monitor air quality, train employees, and communicate risks—particularly when the **Air Quality Index** reaches hazardous levels of 150 or higher.

However, the law **expressly exempts trucking companies**, as well as mine operators, emergency service providers, and very small employers (10 or fewer employees), from these requirements.

## Medical Card Certification Update

FMCSA has extended its waiver that allows drivers to continue carrying a paper medical examiner's certificate (MEC) for up to **60 days after issuance (previously 15 days)**. This extension responds to the nationwide challenges that have arisen since the rollout of the NRII rule in late June. To avoid operational delays and issues, please remind your drivers to request a paper copy from their medical examiner.

## TRANSPORTATION SECURITY CORNER


### **RMAST (Risk Mitigation Activities for Surface Transportation)**
